

RMGC News and Notes:

March 27, 2026

- We survived the blizzard of March 2026 with only a few branches and sticks down. With the deep drifts we finally were able to re-open Wednesday March 24 for walking golf. Snow still remains between holes 5 and 6 keeping that 9 closed until Monday March 30.
- Less Little was the first one off for opening day version 2 but without his friends Rudy and Gerry who joined him on the first opening day.
- Carts??? We will start allowing carts on Sunday March 29 and should have a full golf course that day. In spring, cart use is a day-to-day decision.
- The course is in good spring condition but obviously still greening up. After the snow, things are a little greener and hopefully we will get some consistent weather to bring it along.
- The golf shop is full of awesome apparel, shoes, hats, bags, push carts and the newest in ball technology from Taylor Made and Titleist.
- Local legend Terry is back from the Arizona golf tour and ready to greet you in the mornings with our other Local Legend Mike in the afternoons.

March 12, 2026

March 4, 2026

- It looks like some warm weather is coming. It is too early to say when the course may open. We will open the first day we can do so without damage but right now the ground is froze. As it thaws it will get soft, then extremely wet and soft as frozen water in the soil works up to the surface and then it will be soft again and then we can open. But in checks yesterday and our monitor on 3 green there is still frost in the greens so we have a bit to go.
- Stock is starting to come into the golf shop with fancy new balls that fly further and are almost guaranteed to reduce your scores. We are often asked if all balls brands and models are the same and is it worth paying top dollar for Prov1 or TP5's. The answer depends on your skills and what you want out of your game. A top ball will give a player with good equipment and a good swing a better result. Balls are built different to match your swing, some fly high, some low some spin more some less. It is best to try different models to find one that fits your swing and equipment.
- In the clubhouse work continues on the banquet rooms new look.
- On the course as soon as it firms up spring cleanup of bunkers and sticks from winter winds and storms will start.
- Staff, we had a lot of applicants for not too many jobs so it will take a bit to sort out who is returning and who we will need to hire. When you apply for a job you are excited and want to find out if you have it, but it does take some time.
 - Terry has move on to the Florida Golf Tour for two weeks before returning to the Arizona Circuit before returning home.
 - Rich is healing well and is starting to work in the shop putting out new stock.

- As soon as the weather breaks we will have regular hours but as of today we are still at Wednesdays 8 til 2 for shopping.

February 23, 2026

- Winter has returned after the warm spell. We were getting close to thawing enough frost out of the ground to open the course but it remained too wet. A couple hundred players did enjoy some range time. As a general rule, we do not open the course until the ground thaws and firms up. This avoids any damage on those soggy days when the frost is melting and releasing moisture to the surface. The range continues to be open from the ball machine and off the high quality tee line when conditions allow, or players want to brave the cold.
- Work in progress:
 - Maintenance is working diligently on the equipment fleet to get it ready for the new season. Preventative maintenance now, reduces failures in the season. And with new fairway and rough mowers costing over \$80,000 each, it is important to protect that investment.
 - Reel grinding is a key component of the winter maintenance and we have professional grinding equipment for reels and bed knives to provide a quality cut at our low mowing heights.
 - Our talented maintenance department is also helping with the banquet room rehab with new colors and features. Our clubhouse may be a barn, but it is a good looking well-functioning barn!
 - Cleaning, polishing and organizing in the Barn Bar and Grill continues with Peter deep cleaning and getting ready for a busy golf season.
 - In the golf shop new merchandise is arriving and will soon be in ready for sale. Outings are being contacted and details worked out so they can maximize their fundraising efforts.
- Patrick Crowley, a long-time course member was laid to rest Saturday. A Soo Line employee Pat was part of the weekday railroad group and will be missed.
- Mike is recovering quickly from the rib injury while Terry, Bernie and Tom enjoy the Arizona Sun waiting for spring to come.
